We have had a busy start to the new term and are thoroughly enjoying our new topics. We have learnt about the seasons in our first geography lesson and have now moved on to learning about St. George's Day as part of our learning about the countries of the UK. We have had an exciting start to our forest school sessions and the children in Swan's Class certainly threw themselves into it.



R- Owlets

A very exciting lesson we had this week was geography, we went on a walk round our local area to look at the different types of houses in Burnley.

We have had a great week in Skylarks! We have started our Inventive Victorians topic and have begun learning about the Lancashire Cotton Industry. We have also had a go at sewing in DT which we really enjoyed. In English, we have hot seated the characters of Theseus and Ariadne and have written super complex sentences about them. We are doing well with fractions in Maths too!

We have had a great week in Year 4. We have been looking at plate tectonics in geography and understanding how earthquakes are created. 


6- Eagles
